Clean-up and Hazardous Waste Dates

2018 Clean-Up Dates

Fall Clean-up: September 25 - 28, 2018

Garbage must be placed at curbside the day before their regular garbage collection day.

Items that will be picked up: Televisions, microwaves, any type of appliance (toasters, kettles, grills, fryers, etc.), bagged leaves, furniture, appliances, tree limbs (no longer than 4 feet) neatly tied in bundles and construction debris (up to 50 kg placed in a separate pile).

Items that will NOT be picked up: cars/car parts, trees/brush, household hazardous wastes, or items from apartments greater than 4 units (currently not receiving municipal pick-up).

BLACK GARBAGE BAGS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

2018 Eco-Depot (Household Hazardous Waste Depot) Dates

August 15 & 16, 2018: 12 - 8 pm Tantramar Veteran's Memorial Civic Centre

The following items will be accepted:

Computer towers, servers, laptops, monitors, keyboards, mouse, scanners, printers, fax machines, VCR's, DVD players, stereos, calculators, telephones, pagers, typewriters, audio/video equipment, computer cords, Batteries, LED bulbs, motor oil, paint, etc.

The following will not be accepted:

Televisions, microwaves, any type of appliance (toasters, kettles, grills, fryers, etc.). These items can be put out as part of your clean-up weeks.



Town Hall Updates

The July meeting of Council was another busy one. Here is a list of some of the more interesting motions that were approved by Council:

Council requested assistance from the Union of Municipalities of NB to help advance changes in funding for municipalities pertaining to flood risk near rail lines, as well as fire emergency response on highways, and recreational infrastructure & services.

Council authorized the following members to attend the 2018 Union of Municipalities of New Brunswick Conference in September: Mayor Higham and Councillors Bruce Phinney, Allison Butcher, Andrew Black, Joyce O'Neil, Bill Evans and Michael Tower.

Council gave second and third reading to repeal the Heritage By-law and formally dissolved the Heritage Board.

Council declared the old event tent surplus, and authorized its disposal to Commercial Tent Ltd. for \$1,500, plus HST.



Council authorized the Mayor and Clerk to sign a 5-year land use agreement with Wild Wonder Inc. to operate an outdoor based recreation program in Beech Hill Park.

Council authorized an additional \$24,006.25, HST included, in expenses to Crandall Engineering for a variety of work pertaining to the Town's Environmental Impact Assessment for Lorne Street Phase II.

Council awarded tender No. 2018-07, the reconstruction of Main St from Dufferin St to Queens Rd, to Bowser's Construction in the reduced amount of \$1,044,000.00, HST incl.

Council approved membership into the New Brunswick Cultural Coast for 2018 in the amount of \$4,438.79.

Council gave final approval to a rezoning application for property at the corner of Crossman and York Street, which will allow Bob Edgett's Boxing Club to construct a new clubhouse.
