#### **BY-LAW NO. 258**

# TOWN OF SACKVILLE BY-LAW DESIGNATING ROADS ACCESSIBLE TO OFF-ROAD VEHICLES.

Pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Off-Road Vehicle Act*, S.N.B. 1985, c. O-1.5 and its amendments, the Council of the Town of Sackville duly assembled enacts as follows:

#### **Definitions:**

1. "Off-road vehicle" has the same meaning as defined in the *Off-Road Vehicle Act*, with the exception of excluding a motorized snow vehicle.

### **General provisions:**

- 2. All persons operating an Off-Road Vehicle must operate such in accordance with the Off-Road Vehicle Act and any amendments thereto.
- 3. No person shall drive an off-road vehicle on streets within the Town of Sackville with the exception of **Mallard Drive and Wright Street** other than at the locations designated for this purpose and as further set out below and on a map attached to this By-Law as Schedule "A".
- 4. Off-road vehicles shall only be driven on **Mallard Drive** designated as municipal jurisdiction **for a distance of 364 meters** and further set out on the map attached to this By-Law as Schedule "A".
- 5. Off-road vehicles shall only be driven on **Wright Street** designated as municipal jurisdiction **for a distance of 341 meters** and further set out on the map attached to this by-law as Schedule A.
- 6. The driver or any occupant of the Off-Road Vehicle must be properly wearing a helmet that complies with the standards prescribed by Regulations under the *Motor Vehicle Act*.
- 7. The Off-Road Vehicle must be outfitted with the necessary equipment as described in the *Off-Road Vehicle Act*.
- 8. Off-Road Vehicles must operate in the same direction as traffic and travel in a single file to the extreme right of the street.
- 9. Off-Road Vehicles shall give the appropriate signals as required under the *Motor Vehicle Act* and obey all traffic control devices.
- 10. Any other vehicle utilizing the street shall have the right of way.
- 11. Off-road vehicles may use Wright Street and Mallard Drive at the specific locations in this by-law as long as they have a trail permit of an ATV Club federated in New Brunswick or

in another province member of a reciprocal agreement with New Brunswick, this permit being in the form of a sticker which must be clearly and permanently displayed on the ATV or on the side-by-side. The driver must be able to immediately provide a registration document and an insurance document for the vehicle. A license plate with a valid sticker must be visible.

### Offence:

10. Any person who violates sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of this By-Law is guilty of an offence and is liable upon summary conviction to a fine of \$100.00.

## **Coming into force**

11. This By-Law comes into force upon the approval of the Minister as defined under the *Off-Road Vehicle Act*.

Read a first time this 8th day of April, 2019.

Read a second time this 14th day of May, 2019.

Read a third time and done and passed Council this 14th day of May, 2019.
