François Pelletier

François Pelletier has been a pavement artist for over 20 years, proudly bringing to the streets around the globe various major artworks from Da Vinci, Caravaggio and Delacroix amongst others, as well as many personal compositions. He focuses mainly on reproducing classical oil paintings with soft pastels as his medium, directly onto the pavement as well as on canvases.

Emma Hassencahl-Perley

Emma Hassencahl-Perley is Wolastoquey from Tobique First Nation, NB. She currently resides in Fredericton working as an emerging curator at the Beaverbrook Art Gallery, a casual instructor at the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design, and a practicing multidisciplinary artist. Emma graduated from Mount Allison University in 2017 with a Bachelor of Fine Arts. Her work critiques the relationship between Indigenous Peoples and the settler state and society of Canada. Her work also explores legislative identity and her own identity as a Wolastoquey woman.

Brittney Frazer

Brittney Frazer is a returning artist to this year's festival. She has decorated the town with Canadian themed chalk art for the last two years, celebrating the country's 150th anniversary and honouring George Stanley with her pieces.
