Trail Etiquette and Safety

While on trails, residents must:

- Walk, run, and cycle on the right;
- Cyclists must travel a maximum of 15 kilometres per hour;
- Wheels yield to heels – give pedestrians the right of way;
- When passing, sound a bell or use your voice and pass to the left;
- Keep pets on leash and clean up after them;
- Stay on the trail to preserve natural vegetation and private property.
- Take all of your litter home with you, or dispose of it in an appropriate manner.

Nature Trails

Sackville Waterfowl Park

This award-winning 55-acre park features 3.5 kms of accessible walking trails and boardwalks, including a section of the Trans-Canada trail (The Great Trail). Just minutes from the highway and a short walk from downtown, visitors have spotted 60 bird species (including 26 confirmed breeding species), and 200 species of plants.

Guided tours are offered May to August, or you can pick up a self-guided tour map from the Visitor Information Centre at the end of Mallard Drive.



The Great Trail

A multi-use recreational trail built on a former rail bed. From Sackville you can walk or cycle 33 km to a working fishing wharf in Port Elgin, and continue to Cape Tormentine, Cape Jourmain, and the Confederation Bridge.



Hike and Ski

Crooked Tree Trail Network

- Crooked Tree** 2.4 km
- Red Trail** 2.7 km
- Blue North** 2.8 km
- Yellow Trail** 3.1 km
- Gastug (The Yews)**
- Le Rond** 1.8 km

Well-marked wilderness trail maintained by the Tantramar Outdoor Club. Groomed in winter for cross-country skiing. Includes a 3.6 km hiking/snow shoeing course, 12.8+ kms of cross-country ski trails, rest huts and benches, and a ski lodge for warming up in.



Ogden Loop

3.55 kms of hiking and snow shoeing trails accessible from the south side of Walker Road, at the head of the Crooked Tree Trail.



Beech Hill Park

Enjoy picnicking, a panoramic view of the Tantramar Marsh, a disc golf course, and three hiking trails (1.8, 3, and 5 km). Also used for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing in winter.

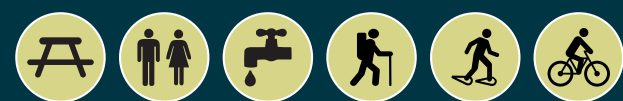
