TANTRAMAR WOULD LIKE TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT WE ARE LOCATED WITHIN THE TERRITORY OF MIXMAYKI, THE UNCEDED, ANCESTRAL TERRITORY OF THE MIXMAY PEOPLE WHO HAVE LIVED HERE FOR MORE THAN 3000 YEARS. IN 1762 LAND LOTS WERE ASSIGNED TO 20 FAMILIES FROM NEW ENGLAND AND THE TOWN OF SACKVILLE WAS OFFICIALLY CREATED. THE NEARBY VILLAGE OF DORCHESTER WAS NAMED IN 1825, BUT WAS SETTLED AROUND THE SAME TIME AS SACKVILLE AND THE SURROUNDING AREAS. IN 2023 THEY WERE ALL AMALGAMATED TO MAKE WHAT IS NOW KNOW AS THE MUNICIPALITY OF TANTRAMAR.




