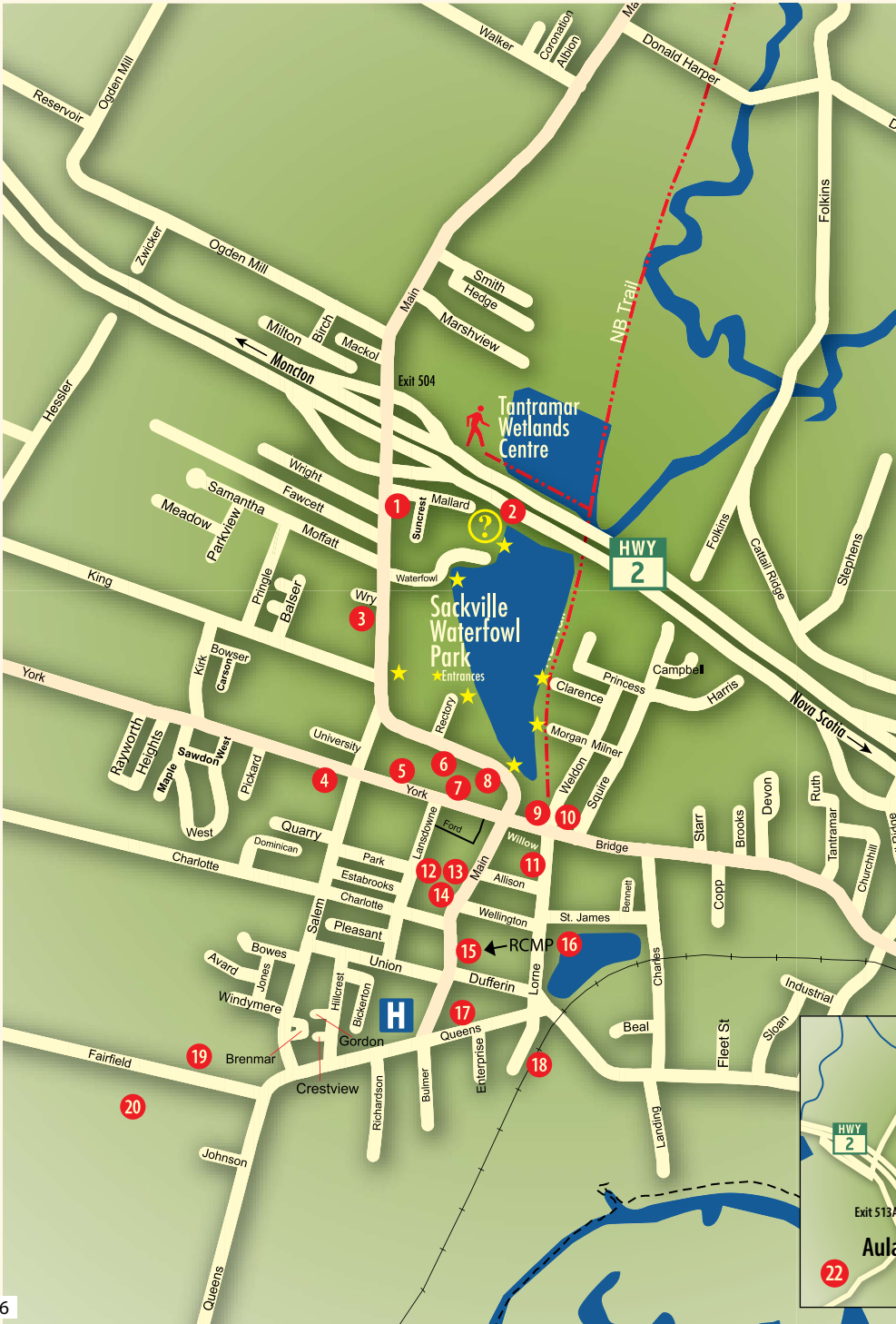

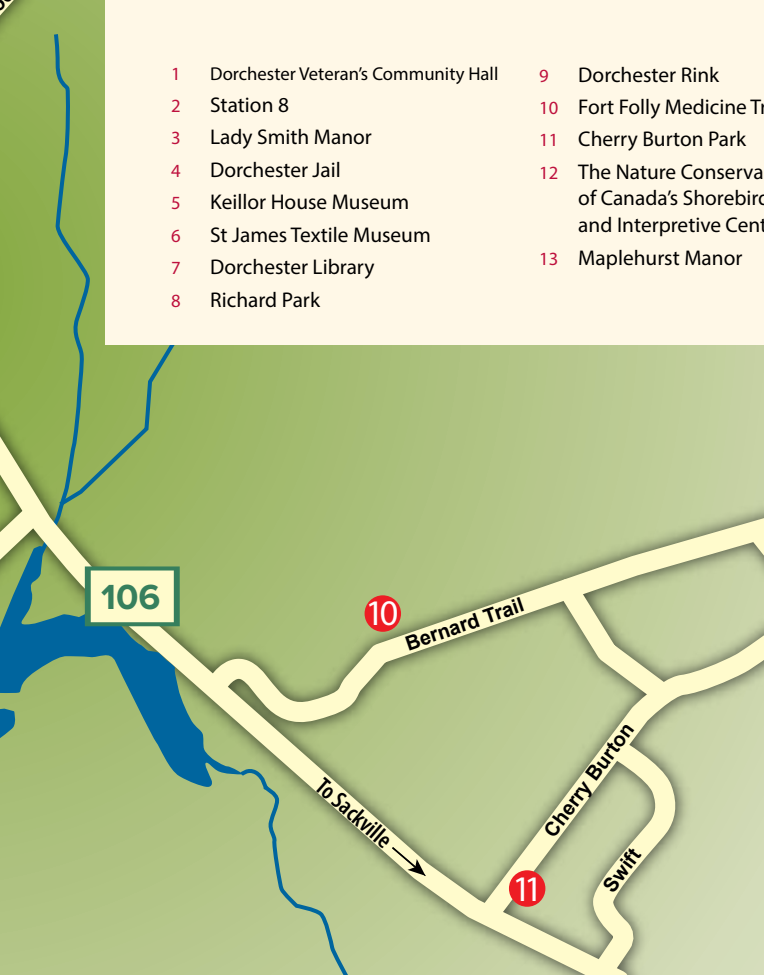

What is Stormwater?

When rain falls on roofs, lawns, and even compacted lawns, it runs off these surfaces and becomes stormwater that is collected in pipes and conveyed to a stream or river. The runoff from these surfaces contains pollutants that are washed into the storm sewers with the rain and ultimately end up in the Tantramar River.

In downtown Sackville and specifically in the Lorne Street area, the amount of stormwater run-off in extreme rain events has exceeded the capacity of the system, which in time causes flooding.

The function of this retention pond is to:

1. Collect and store stormwater to reduce flooding on Lorne Street and the lower sections of the Town.
2. To support a variety of plants that will filter the stormwater of pollutants such as sediments, oil, grease, nutrients, heavy metals, pesticides, and pathogens that is washed into the storm sewer.
3. Provide habitat for birds and aquatic animals.
4. Provide a passive park for the residents of Sackville to enjoy.
