# Municipal Police Service Agreement

- The MPSA is a contract mechanism by which policing services are provided by the RCMP directly to specific municipalities
- The RCMP is under direct contract to some 150 municipalities in Canada
- The MPSA is based on a number of different cost share formulas
- The current MPSA covers a period of 20 years, beginning April 1, 2012 and **expires on March 31, 2032**

# Municipal Police Service Agreement

Cost splits for MPSAs are based on population thresholds.

Between 5000-15,000 population - Municipality pays 70%, federal government pays 30%  
Over 15,000 population - Municipality pays 90%, federal government pays 10%





There are currently 7 MPSAs in New Brunswick:

- Campbellton, Oromocto, Tantramar, St. Andrews, Hampton, Grand Bouctouche – (all 70/30)
- Codiac - Moncton, Dieppe, and Riverview - (90/10)

# What do we do...?

RCMP police officers are responsible for conducting investigations, making arrests, pursuing charges, conducting patrols & traffic enforcement.

**RCMP OFFICERS ARE ALSO REQUIRED TO:**

	attend sudden deaths		attend court
	investigate reports of missing people		liaise with local elected officials
	respond to Mental Health Act calls		conduct curfew checks

Calls are prioritized to ensure that we respond to the most urgent situations first & allocate our resources effectively.

# Triage Calls in order of Priority

**Priority 1** – Major incident in progress

**Priority 2** – Urgent need for police

**Priority 3** – Requires police but no immediate or urgent requirement

**Priority 4** – No police attendance required, may require further action

**Non-Emergency calls that do not require a police dispatch and are diverted to our Alternate Response Unit. The unit provides a call back service to the public and assigns an investigator to the call.**

**Ensures police are dispatched to the Highest Risk, Highest Priority calls.**

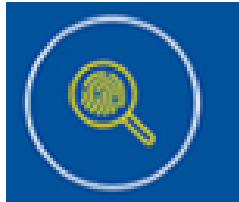

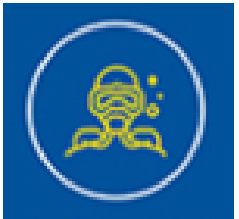

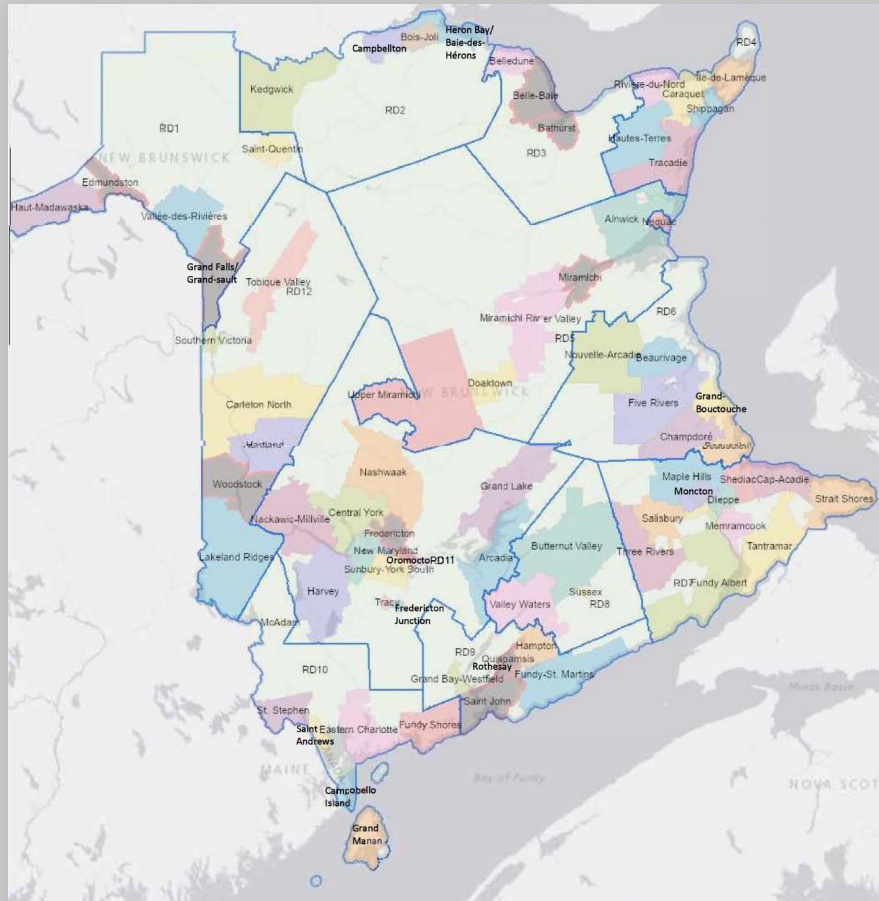

The new [Local Governance Reform](#) (LGR) in New Brunswick (effective on January 1, 2023) encompasses 78 local government entities & 12 rural districts.

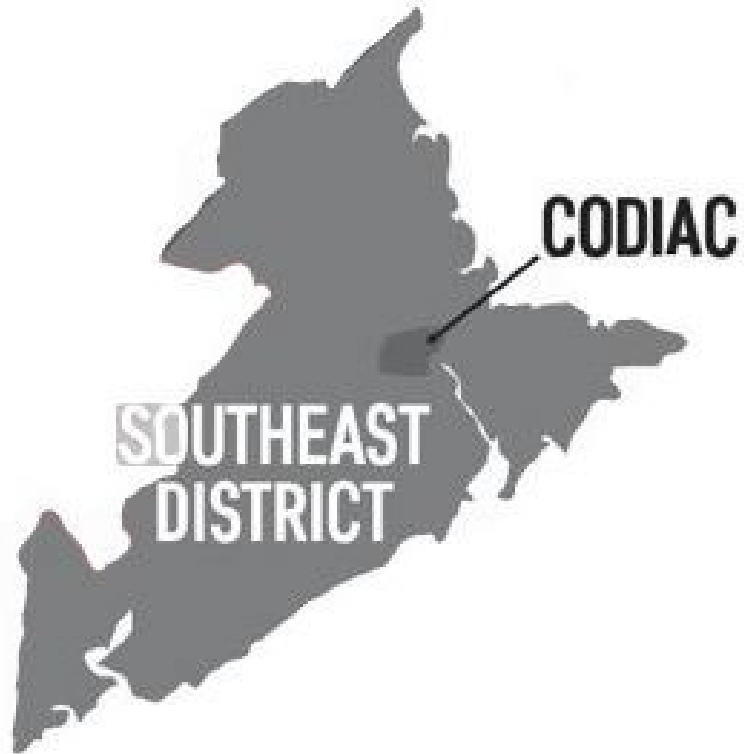

# Community engagement & crime reduction

## Community Crime Reduction Unit

The RCMP's Community Crime Reduction Unit employs two approaches: **person or offender-focused enforcement** and **place-focused crime reduction**.

The Community Crime Reduction Unit is a dedicated team of officers who work closely with frontline officers to address issues such as:

- Break & enters
- Theft of motor vehicles
- Property crime (stolen property)

## Innovation Crime Reduction Unit

Community Program Officers and Community Program Officers for Indigenous Communities focus on community engagement, crime prevention and crime reduction initiatives such as:

- Coordinating Intervention & Diversion programs;
- Participating in Violence Threat Risk Assessments to assess & mitigate threats of violence;
- Participating in Coordinated Community Response team meetings for high risk/high danger intimate partner violence situations;
- Delivering education | awareness presentations & attending community events

# Provincial Crime Reduction Unit



2 women & 4 men were arrested in connection with the investigation.

A 58y woman & a 30y woman, as well as a 36y man & a 62y man were all later released & scheduled to appear in Moncton Provincial Court on January 12, 2024.

# Online crime reporting (OCR)

## WHAT CAN I REPORT USING OCR?

- Animal Call
- Damage/Mischief Under \$5000 to Property
- Damage/Mischief Under \$5000 to Vehicle
- Driving Complaint
- Found Property
- Hate Motivated Incident
- Hate Motivated Incident - Online
- Hit and Run to Property
- Hit and Run to Unoccupied Vehicle
- Hit and Run to Unoccupied Vehicle or Property
- Lost Licence Plates or Decals
- Lost Property
- Stolen Licence Plates or Decals
- Theft of Bicycle Under \$5000
- Theft Under \$5000
- Theft Under \$5000 from Vehicle

## WHY SHOULD I USE OCR?

- It's available 24/7.
- There's no need to visit or call a detachment.
- It provides a report that can be used for insurance purposes.
- It contributes important information to assess crime trends.

### DO NOT USE OCR IF:

- The stolen property includes firearms, credit cards, or personal identification (e.g., driver's licence or passport).
- The value of stolen or damaged property exceeds \$5,000.
- There are witnesses or video evidence of the crime.
- Incidents that do not meet the criteria for OCR are directed to the RCMP's non-emergency line 1-888-506-RCMP.
- Call police or 911 immediately if the incident is still in progress, or if it is an emergency.
