PROPOSAL

To close Harrop Avenue from Highway 106 and School Street from Cape Road to Dorchester Consolidated School, and access to School Street from Church Street from approximately 1:00pm to 4:30pm on Monday, February 17, 2025, to accommodate the Dorchester Beavers Touch-a-Truck Event.
