our services, priorities, and long-term vision.

### Values

### **Important Changes to Waste Pickup in Tantramar!**

**All waste collection in Tantramar is now happening on Mondays only.**

Alternating Weeks for bags – continue current practice:

 Blue Bags – Every second week.

 Clear Bags – Alternates with Blue Bag weeks and can place a bulky item (see below).

 Green Bags (Organics): Collected every week.

If you miss your collection day, there will be no pickups Tuesday through Friday, so plan ahead!

### Bulky Item Collection

No more spring and fall clean-ups. Instead, you can now place 1 bulky item out for pickup on CLEAR BAG collection weeks.

**What's allowed:** Same rules as previous bulk clean-ups.

### Council Highlights – Committee of the Whole, April 28, 2025

Tantramar Regional High School Grade 12 student Kenish Patel presented a detailed analysis on the need for additional streetlights in rural Tantramar. We'd

### **Council Discussions and Directions**

The following items were discussed and forwarded to the consent agenda for the upcoming Regular Council Meeting:

- **Council Summer Meeting Schedule**

Council will consider pausing the July Committee of the Whole and August Regular Council Meetings, with regular meetings resuming in late August. The September Regular Council Meeting is proposed to move to Monday, September 8, 2025.

- **Code of Conduct By-Law**

Council discussed proposed updates to the Code of Conduct By-Law for Members of Council. Council will consider second and third reading of the updated code of conduct by-law for Tantramar.

- **Asphalt Resurfacing Tender**

Council will consider awarding the 2025 asphalt resurfacing contract to Dexter Construction Company Limited, focusing on King Street, the salt shed entrance, and trail improvements near Main and Lansdowne.

- **Wildfire Pump Purchase – Dorchester Fire Department**

Council reviewed a proposal to purchase a wildfire pump to better prepare for the possibility of a wildfire. The item has been moved forward for approval.

- **Animal Control Services Contracts**

Council discussed awarding two contracts for animal control services: PAWS/SPCA for the former Dorchester and local service districts, and Jaime Spicer for the former Sackville area.

- **Emergency Mutual Aid Agreement**

Council reviewed the draft Emergency Mutual Aid Agreement. The item will return for further discussion at a future Regular Council Meeting.

- **Freshwinds Eco-Village Housing Co-operative**

Council will send a letter of support to assist Freshwinds Eco-Village


Housing Co-operative in securing funding for their cooperative housing development.



Weldon Street was named after Richard Chapman Weldon (1849 - 1925), who was a descendant of Yorkshire Settlers born in Penobsquis NB, that went on to be a renowned educator, lawyer, and politician. Some of his accomplishments included being the first PhD on Mount Allison's faculty and the first full-time professor of law in post-confederate Canada at Dalhousie Law School.

The Navigator was then able to offer them many resources for their needs. She found out that they were not connected with the Canadian Dental Care Plan or the New Brunswick Drug Plan. She gave contact and application details for both programs. She asked several questions about the caller's income and discovered that they did not know about the New Brunswick Low Income Seniors Benefit, so they were referred to that program. Finally, they were referred to Social Development for the Homeowner Repair Program. The caller took down all of the information and thanked the Service Navigator for the efficient help.

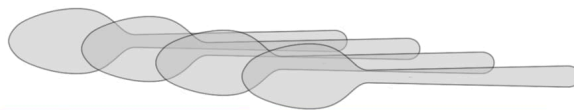
