



Council Updates

Council Highlights - Committee of the Whole, August 25,2025

Council Highlights provide a brief overview of the latest Committee of the Whole meeting. For full details, please refer to the official minutes, which will be available following approval at the upcoming Regular Council Meeting.

As a reminder, Committee of the Whole meetings do not involve formal decisions but serve to inform, explore, and shape future Council direction.

Public Hearings & Information Items

- Zoning By-law Amendment: A public hearing was held on proposed changes to the minimum lot size and frontage requirements for vertically attached dwelling units. First and second reading of the by-law will take place at the September 8 Regular Council Meeting.
- Youth Engagement Report: Summer student Mya Artibello presented her Youth Engagement Report, highlighting best practices for involving youth in municipal decision-making. Council expressed appreciation for Ms.
 Artibello's excellent contributions and wished her success as she returns to Mount Allison University for her third year.
- Traffic Review (Route 106, Dorchester): A study was presented on the feasibility of installing additional signage and speed monitoring devices along Route 106 at the Cape Road/Woodlawn Road intersection. Based on the collected data, changes to traffic control are not deemed to be warranted.
- Councillor Reports: Members shared their experiences from the 2025 FCM Conference, highlighting networking opportunities and learnings from national leaders and other municipalities.

Council Directions

- Bayview Estates Subdivision: Council reviewed a proposal for two new public streets off Queens Road, Sackville. A subdivision agreement will be brought forward at a later meeting. As this is a Class II subdivision, under the Sackville Subdivision By-law the applicant is required to provide land for public purposes and/or cash in lieu of land.
- Tantramar Fire Service: Council will consider the purchase of five positive pressure ventilation fans to improve fire response and discussed the disposal of a 2008 utility trailer previously used by Sackville Fire & Rescue,

with a motion being brought forward at the September 8 Regular Council Meeting.

Policy Updates:

- Flag Protocol Policy (2025–18): Updates include a new communications requirement when flags are lowered to half-mast.
- Compassionate Giving Policy (2025–19): Establishes guidelines for gifts and flowers in cases of illness or sympathy.
- TVMCC Banner Policy (2025–17): An amendment was reviewed to support Minor Hockey tournament banners.
- **UMNB Conference:** Council will appoint a voting representative for the UMNB Conference at the next Regular Council Meeting.
- Infrastructure Projects:
 - Weldon Street Trunk Sewer: Council discussed entering into an easement agreement with the NB Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to facilitate replacement of the Weldon trunk sewer.
 - Provincial Municipal Highway Partnership Program (2028–2030):
 Staff presented proposed projects for funding submission.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that electric power first came to Sackville in 1900 — two years before the cities of Moncton and Fredericton, and five years before Saint John? In that year, the power was supplied by a gasoline generator and ten years later, the system had grown to two generators. By 1927, a new transmission line was built between Amherst and Sackville and the local utility began buying power from the Maccan, N.S., coalfired power plant.

Remembers its Past and Re-tunes its Future.

Celebrating its 21st Anniversary in September, the Sackville Festival of Early Music presents a weekend that honours its founder, features one of today's leading interpreters of Renaissance and Baroque vocal music and highlights a celebrated local choir.



The past began in 2004, when Réjean Poirier invited musicians from France and Quebec to join Acadian performers to commemorate and celebrate the 400th anniversary of the founding of Acadie. From those ROOTS | RACINES the annual festival, now centred at Mount Allison University, has grown and flowered to become recognized for performances by world-class musicians and Canadian artists, offering an exciting once-a-year opportunity for community and visitors to experience performances on period instruments.

It is a delight therefore for the festival to welcome one of Britain's best known and much-loved sopranos for the opening concert on Friday, September 26.

Celebrated for her glorious voice and purity of tone, Dame Emma Kirkby is renowned internationally as a leading interpreter of Renaissance and Baroque music. She will be joined onstage by Canadian lutenist Lucas Harris. "Bringing Emma Kirkby to Sackville is such a joy and a pleasure", says Christina Haldane, Festival Executive Director, "It will be a world-class opening night."

Saturday's concert will highlight music of the French Baroque, performed by the festival's new resident Ensemble SFEM, a group of Canadian historically informed performers from Montreal, led by Sackville-based Baroque violinist Jimin Shin Dobson, the Festival's Artistic Director.

The concluding performance of ROOTS | RACINES will underline the historic connection, and the future focus, as the Choeur Louisbourg, an Acadian professional chamber choir based in Moncton New Brunswick, performs a celebratory concert of Italian Renaissance choral works. Monique Richard directs the 18-member choir alongside the Ensemble SFEM. The choir shares roots with the festival, as it was also founded by Réjean Poirier.

All performances take place in Brunton Auditorium, Department of Music, Mount Allison University, Sackville, New Brunswick, September 26 – 28, 2025. Friday and Saturday evenings at 7:30 pm; Sunday at 2:00 pm. Community outreach is always an important part of the annual festival. This year it includes workshops about the period musical instruments and a Q&A discussion with Emma Kirkby. These events will take place in Brunton Auditorium and in local schools.

As the festival continues to offer exceptional music opportunities to Canadian and world-wide performers, it is supported by Heritage Canada, the Canada Council for the Arts, Mount Allison University, the J. E. A. Crake Foundation, the Government of New Brunswick, le Secrétariat aux affaires intergouvernementales canadiennes Québec, the town of Sackville, Tantramar NB, the local community and donations from many music lovers.



Caregiver Counselling and Support
Caregivers need and deserve support.
When caregivers or their loved ones
contact 211, Service Navigators will help
them assess their needs, and find them
the assistance and support that they
need.



A 211 Service Navigator took a call from an adult woman. She requested some resources for a male family member. When the Service Navigator probed for more details on the situation, the caller said that he was the sole caregiver of his wife who had severe dementia. When the Service Navigator queried as to what assistance would be most helpful, the caller expressed that caregiver counselling and emotional support were most needed.

After conducting a thorough assessment, the Service Navigator searched for resources for the caller's relative. She referred the caller to the Alzheimer Society of New Brunswick, and the caller's local Community Addiction and Mental Health Services. She described the services and respective roles for each agency, and made sure the caller knew exactly how her relative could access assistance from both organizations.

The caller took down all of the information and thanked the Service Navigator, who encouraged the caller to contact 211 again anytime that she or her relative needed information and referrals to services in the community.




